


Neighborhood Health

Based on Foreclosures, Service Requests, Free and Reduced Lunch, Crime Data, and Owner Occupancy Rates




Neighborhood Health was determined by ranking each individual indicator and summing those rankings. The health of the neighborhood is determined in comparison with the other areas.






Police Calls




These figures represent the amount of police calls per 100 households. Calls are comprised of residential burglaries, stealing from a vehicle, drugs, and domestic violence.


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Service Requests



Service Requests




These figures represent the amount of service request calls per 100 households. Calls are comprised of trash, weeds, inoperable vehicles, and dangerous buildings.


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Owner Occupancy Rates





EXPLANATIONS

Crime per 100:

Police Calls are comprised of residential burglaries, stealing from a vehicle, drugs, and domestic violence. The numbers shown are per 100 households.

Requests per 100:

Request Calls are comprised of trash, weeds, inoperable vehicles, and dangerous buildings. The numbers shown are per 100 households.

Foreclosures:

Foreclosures are tracked in the Neighborhoods and Planning Office by information provided by the Greene County Recorder's Office

Owner Occ:

This is determined by Information provided by the Greene County Assessor's Office

A few changes to this data:

The addition of The Fairfield Acres/Bissett Neighborhood Service Area.

The crime data for the Midtown NSA previously included the Walk-In Reports taken at the Police station on Chestnut, those have been removed to provide a more accurate account for the NSA.

Since there are multiple NSAs with identical foreclosure numbers, its not proportionate to rank from 1-26. I have since started including ties (all zero foreclosures tied for first place) so the rankings aren't skewed.
